'Typical' audience? It Doesn't Exist!

Someone asked me the other day: Describe a typical Bread & Roses audience.

Impossible, I replied. Each venue is so different.

In one week our volunteer performers may entertain toddlers at a children's hospital, the elderly residents of a nursing facility and young adults in a home for the developmentally disabled. The next week, venues might include a residential treatment program for substance abusers, a shelter for abused women and the mental health ward of a hospital.

It's all part of our mission: uplifting spirits by presenting live entertainment for people who are isolated from society.

But as **The Mamas and the Papas** observed way back in the '60s, "Nothing's quite as sure as change." Today we're seeing drastic changes in one of the populations we serve – the homeless.

At Raphael House, a San Francisco shelter for families, Olivia Garcia sees whole families showing up with no place to live.

"Our population is incredibly diverse," says Garcia, coordinator of Raphael House's evening children's program. "We get every sort of person you can imagine – low-income families, women fleeing domestic abuse, people in recovery, political refugees from other countries.

"These days the usual cause is the poor economy. Through downsizing or budget cuts, one or both parents lose their jobs and

adds. "Everything we do is through the eyes of the child – with the goal of creating a safe and stable environment."

Ideally, after three to six months, the family's finances become more stable, permitting them to move into permanent housing.

A t **Harrison House** in Berkeley, the overall goal – moving the residents into permanent housing – is the same, but the approach is different.

Explains **Daniel Barth**, community coordinator: "Our mission is to help homeless people attain self-sufficiency, and we do that by addressing the root causes of homelessness."

Instead of spending evenings at the shelter and days on their own, the 100 or so residents of Harrison House are engaged in a comprehensive daytime program that aims to help them obtain housing and achieve income security while providing a sense of family and community, and giving residents the tools to avoid making unhealthy decisions.

"We find that the homeless are in survival mode. We want them to slow down and trust other people, give back and invest in

The Silva Watson Moonwalk Fund

In July 1969, advertising executive **Larry Silva** and developer **Douglas Watson** met and became life partners. At the same time, the Apollo astronauts were walking on the moon.

Twenty-five years later, Larry Silva died of AIDS. Doug Watson and his close friend, attorney **Vivian Schneider**, realized how hard a terminal illness is on the person afflicted, on family and on loved ones. When Doug died the next year, he left a sizable bequest to a new foundation, **The Silva Watson Moonwalk Fund**, with Vivian Schneider as president.

"People suffering a terminal illness have immediate needs – food, shelter, medical care – and we're in a position to help them immediately," said Vivian. a resident of Kentfield.

In 2000, Vivian met **Mimi Fariña** and decided, "Bread & Roses is an organization we want to help." By itself, even a fund like Silva Watson Moonwalk can't meet a fraction of the world's needs. "But when someone else has set up the trail, you can follow," she says.

We are grateful that The Silva Watson Moonwalk Fund has been an important supporter of Bread & Roses and our healing work of bringing music to those who are isolated.

Olivia Garcia and Daniel Barth both endorse the work Bread & Roses is doing to lift the spirits of homeless people. Says Garcia, "Tuesdays are our show nights, and the whole family gets involved. We dance and sing together, arm in arm. It's great to see little toddlers twirling around to the music."

Barth: "No matter what is going on in our lives, when Bread & Roses shows up, we have respite. There's always a little festival on Monday evenings. Folks leave in good spirits, with smiles on their faces."

The uncertainties in the economy are affecting all of us.

Nonprofit agencies face the challenge of helping an increasing number of clients with complex needs, coupled with reductions in staff positions.



Some facilities, like the much-loved homeless shelter **Marian Residence for Women** in San Francisco, have been forced to close. Sadly, we have watched as several of our other client facilities have closed in the past two years. We can assure you that when this happens, we work quickly to commence service to a new client facility so we continue to reach as many of our isolated neighbors in need as possible.

Our strategy for managing our program during this downturn is to present more shows and serve more institutions by becoming more effective and efficient. To do this, we have improved the process of scheduling volunteer hosts for our shows, thereby freeing up more staff time to recruit and coach performers. We have also hired a part-time program associate in the East Bay to host more shows in that region and recruit local performers, thus reducing the commute distance for performers and hosts.

We are confident of our ability to continue to bring hope and healing through live music and other live performance to a wide spectrum of isolated audiences throughout the Bay Area. However, there is one thing you could do to help us.

If you know of a homeless shelter or a youth facility where we could make a significant difference, please tell us so that we can be sure to explore the possibilities. We are not going to let the slow economy slow down the joy, hope and healing. Thanks to all of our volunteers and donors for supporting Bread & Roses so generously.
