THIRTY YEARS!

Changing Lives, Uplifting Spirits, Opening Hearts

Thirty years ago, an idea was born. To **Mimi Fariña**, it seemed so simple: there are people among us who can't come to the music, so take the music to them.

Many things have changed since 1974. The population of California has grown and become increasingly diverse. More individuals of all ages are being institutionalized. The state's income has failed to keep pace with its expenses.

For the isolated and institutionalized in the Bay Area, entertainment used to be one component of comprehensive care. Today that is not the case.

Like everything else in the state, since the mid-1970s, the process of entertaining isolated people has grown increasingly complex. Everywhere you look – from juvenile facilities to homes for the developmentally disabled to residential programs for the elderly – if an organization gets even part of its funding from public sources, the squeeze is on.

The arts are the first to go. Says **Connie Hirschmugl**, a longtime activities director in residential care for the elderly and disabled, "The activities department is at the bottom of the food chain. It has the smallest budget, the least amount of respect and support. We feel like champions fighting for a cause – the cause of the residents."

As facilities struggle to provide even basic services with vastly reduced budgets, the free, high-quality entertainment Bread & Roses provides has become invaluable, depended upon to fill a huge void in the system.

miserably at getting along with others – a place to chill.

Until seven years ago, these problem kids were sent to private school or home-schooled. Now, TLC fills the need, gradually weaning them away from what Tom calls "their emotional behavior and street-gang involvement" and showing them a way to get "back on track and back into the classroom."

For all its success, TLC exists on the margins of the West

Contra Costa School District. “We’re in a really needy situation,” Tom says. “We have 13 classrooms, 10 of them in portable buildings with no running water. Only recently we got a fountain put in outside so the kids could get a drink.”

“The children come here because they had problems in other schools. This may be their last chance before juvenile hall.”

At a school where even the basics are hard to come by, finding money for culture verges on the impossible, says principal **Baby Raff**.

“There was a time when our district was so solvent that our students got classes in dance and ballet, the arts. That was taken away. Then we had a music teacher a couple of times a week. That’s gone.”

Through Bread & Roses, “Our kids get to see performances they never would see because they are so costly. You can see it on their faces – the performers open up whole new careers to them. Bread & Roses works hard to find performers who appeal to our students. When they see them up there rapping, and doing their dances with such grace and style, it makes our kids realize that they could do something with their talents.”



In the past 14 years, Director **Brenda McIvor**’s institution, **Cedars of Marin**, has received exactly one cost-of-living increase in the monetary support it receives for caring for the developmentally disabled residents.

Today, says activities and volunteer coordinator **Denise Bondy**, “Our population is aging, and their desire to be out after 9 p.m. is non-existent. That’s the time when musicians ordinarily play, so having Bread & Roses come to us is

wonderful.”

Every person residing on The Cedars’ Ross campus attends the Bread & Roses performances.

“When Bread & Roses shows up, we organize birthday parties around them because no one wants to stay in their rooms,” says Bondy.

“As a non-profit, we have greater expectations with no additional funds. Everything has changed.”

In the past, The Cedars was able to pay for musical entertainment out of its general fund, but those days are gone.

Says McIvor: “We’re not reimbursed for recreation. But regardless of funding cuts, we still find it necessary to provide this staple of life.”



As an officer with the Marin Activity Coordinators group, **Connie Hirschmugl** has seen a lot that’s right and a lot that’s wrong in caring for the elderly.

Hirschmugl entered the field 10 years ago as a home health aide and immediately saw the need for meaningful activity for her clients.

“The days just went on one after another. Their physical needs were taken care of, but they weren’t engaging with life.”

In her present position as Activity Director at **Smith Ranch Care**, in San Rafael, Hirschmugl has a small budget for entertainment, but it doesn’t stretch very far, and at the same time it’s a pittance for

a working musician, she says.

“Bread & Roses comes in six times a year. (Program Director) **Carole Robinson** knows just the type of entertainer I’m looking for. She recently sent me **Annie Rainwater**, a young gal, wonderful on the piano. The people here are starving for youth. They were just hanging on to her.”



It is this serious effort to carefully match audiences with performers who will uplift their spirits that continues to challenge and inspire Bread & Roses.

The mechanics of bringing life, light and music to people who can’t get out is more complex in Bread & Roses’ 30th year than it was in 1974, but at its core, the job remains the same – bring entertainment, hope and healing to those who are alone.

In 1974, Mimi understood how important this simple mission would become. Today, her vision is validated by a world of need and more than 20,000 individuals each year whose lives are changed – one day at a time – by Bread & Roses.

Peter Merts in the Spotlight at Mill Valley Photo Exhibit

Recent and vintage photos taken by San Rafael photographer **Peter Merts** at Bread & Roses institutional shows throughout the years will be featured at a **Mill Valley City Hall** Exhibit in October.

The exhibit will be on view throughout the month, with a special opening reception as part of Mill Valley's "First Tuesday" open house event on October 5 from 6 to 8 p.m.

A long-time volunteer photographer, event volunteer and former staff event coordinator for Bread & Roses (1978- '81), Peter Merts is the recent recipient of a 2004 **Marin Arts Council** Individual Artist Grant. He also had a recent solo exhibition at *XIII Encuentros Abiertos de Fotografia* in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

Peter's first serious foray into black-and-white photography began in his early days at Bread & Roses when he started taking photos of institutional shows.

In his selection of images for the Mill Valley exhibition, Peter hopes that the spirit of Bread & Roses will come through in the telling of the stories of the shows through different visual perspectives.

Peter fondly remembers his early participation with Bread & Roses as co-producer of several of the first weekend-long Greek Theatre Festivals held in Berkeley in the late 1970s. He recollects those early days as a "wild and intensely exhilarating time" in which they all "pulled off more than they thought they could."

Most of all, he remembers the team spirit, guided by **Mimi Fariña's** vision, that the tone of the event be kind-hearted and loving for both audience and backstage.

He marvels that 30 years later, this same quality is manifest throughout Bread & Roses' ongoing program.

Festival! Screening Benefits Bread & Roses

Bread & Roses presented a very special benefit film screening of *Festival!* on Tuesday, May 25, at the **Christopher B. Smith Rafael Film Center** in San Rafael.

The sold-out screening was followed by a question-and-answer session with **Joan Baez** and filmmaker **Murray Lerner**, moderated by **Marin Independent Journal** columnist **Paul Liberatore**.

Photos from the 1965 Newport Folk Festival by **Andrew deLory**, a long-time Bread & Roses volunteer photographer, were also on display.

Festival!, an Oscar-nominated documentary film, captures spontaneous interviews and vibrant folk music during the 1963-66 Newport Folk Festivals.

Performers include **Joan Baez**, **Bob Dylan**, **Pete Seeger**, **Peter, Paul and Mary**, **Judy Collins**, **Odetta**, **Son House**, **Mississippi John Hurt**, a cameo appearance by **Mimi** and **Richard Fariña**, and many others.

A number of the legendary performers who are featured in the film have supported Bread & Roses through the years and continue to do so today.

The importance of playing and communicating through live music is a theme that resonates throughout the film.

Of the rare screening of this documentary film and its relevance to Bread & Roses today, Executive Director **Cassandra Flipper** said, "Mimi Fariña started Bread & Roses in 1974 with an acoustic music show that she performed

Thirty years ago,

Mimi Fariña founded the nonprofit organization Bread & Roses. Ever since then, Bread & Roses has been changing lives, combating hopelessness and lifting hearts for the Bay Area's most isolated, disadvantaged and disenfranchised children, teens, adults and elders.

Since 1974, thousands of performers both internationally known and regionally based, have volunteered for Bread & Roses. With their ongoing help and the support of many others, Bread & Roses produced 504 shows last year for 23,000 audience members in 105 facilities throughout the Bay Area.

Providing free, live, quality entertainment is as important now as it was then. People who live in institutions still eagerly anticipate Bread & Roses shows. The agency fills the same need today as it did 30 years ago, except the need is even greater.

As a singer-songwriter and guitarist, Mimi touched Bread & Roses audiences. Today, a wide variety of performers make the same impact in convalescent homes, AIDS facilities, drug and alcohol rehabilitation centers, special needs schools, centers for the developmentally disabled, detention facilities and homeless shelters.
