## Run for Bread & Roses in the *Marin Human Race*

**B**read & Roses will participate in the **Marin Human Race**, a 5K run/walk, on Saturday, May 12, at the Marin Center Fairgrounds and Lagoon.

This is the 25th annual event benefiting Marin nonprofits, Marin County's largest collaborative fundraising event. Ninety percent of donations collected by individuals who register on behalf of Bread & Roses will support our program of bringing live performing arts to people isolated in Bay Area institutions.

Donations received this year will also be matched by a challenge grant made by **The Dennis and Susan Gilardi Fund of the Marin Community Foundation**.

"I am delighted that our challenge grant is stimulating others to reach out in new ways to support Bread & Roses," says Board Co-Chair **Susan Gilardi**. "This is

our first year in this event, and I am proud and happy that donations will have twice the impact upon our program."

Singer, songwriter and guitarist **Elaine Dempsey and Friends**, Bread & Roses volunteer performers, will entertain along the race route. At a Bread & Roses booth we'll hand out special gifts to those who participate in the race on our behalf.

Registration begins at 7 a.m.; race time is 8:30 a.m. The **Center for Volunteer and Nonprofit Leadership**, organizer of the event, is also presenting a **Community and Family Fun Fair** from 7:30 a.m. until noon.

We are recruiting runners/walkers for this event, a unique opportunity to do some community building and fundraising on behalf of Bread & Roses.

## Bay Area Youth in the Spotlight

Here is how Bread & Roses is making a difference in the lives of young people around the Bay – on stage, behind the scenes and in the audience.



In inner-city Oakland, young people who live in a world that's sometimes scary and dangerous are learning about a more positive side of life through **Youth Movement Records**.

Through Bread & Roses, YMR hip-hop performers entertain at youth facilities in the Bay Area – giving the young people housed in those institutions a chance to see positive role models their own age.

YMR teaches young people much more than performing and recording. Says **Carlos Windham**, known to the young people at YMR as **Brutha Los**: “We are teaching young people to advocate for themselves, how to have positive relationships and develop into adults who can function in the world.”



San Francisco's **Raphael House**, founded in 1971, was the

city's first shelter for homeless families. Today, Raphael House is dedicated to helping at-risk children and their families achieve stable housing and financial independence.

“The families look forward to Bread & Roses programs on Tuesday nights – it's their regular time to enjoy a performance together,” says **Jennifer Schott**, coordinator of Raphael House's **Children's Evening Program**.

“Bread & Roses gives our families a very low-stress and pleasurable experience, something that is hard to come by.”

Children who don't have a permanent home have “a fragmented perception of the world,” she says. “We try to provide them with a well-rounded, holistic exposure to different parts of life – including

music that they would not have the opportunity to see otherwise.”

Bread & Roses “brings in high-quality performers – people we wouldn’t be able to afford to present – and no matter what mood our families are in when they arrive, by the end they have come to a brighter place.”



In Marin, high-school junior **Brigette Barnato** made her Bread & Roses debut at a senior residential facility, thrilling her listeners with songs from **Guys and Dolls** and other show tunes from the ’40s.

Brigette is unusual. She’s looked at Bread & Roses from both sides, now: as a volunteer helping set up shows and more recently as a performer.

Recalling her show at **Northgate Convalescent Hospital** in San Rafael, the Greenbrae teen remembers being surprised:

“The audience was mainly women, and all were in wheelchairs.

One lady I’ll never forget – she had a stroke and couldn’t speak, but from her facial expression I could understand her. Once in a while she would make the OK sign with her hand, and she smiled after every song.”

Last spring, Brigette interned at Bread & Roses for nine weeks, giving her the chance to work behind the scenes and attend many shows. “I learned a lot. One thing is that I never realized what a smile can mean to a performer.”

When her school year at the **Team Program at Tamiscal High School** in Larkspur ends, Brigette wants to continue working with Bread & Roses and performing with the youth group the **Academy DeTurk**.

While attending the **Heart of Marin** Awards Luncheon in January, I realized that Bread & Roses serves many of the agencies that nominate their volunteers for special recognition at the annual event.

In serving more than 100 institutions in the San Francisco Bay Area, I believe that Bread & Roses partners with and supports more nonprofits than any other nonprofit in the region – except management services organizations (MSOs) like **CompassPoint** and the **Center for Volunteer and Nonprofit Leadership**.

Imagine Bread & Roses in the center of an enormous wheel with more than 100 spokes. Then picture 1,400 volunteer performers singing, dancing and juggling all around the wheel – 365 days a year – bringing joy, hope and healing to people shut away from the rest of us.

As a matter of fact, the number and variety of facilities we serve make it possible for us to be a source of continuity for individuals who spend time in more than one institution.

A young woman in a rehab facility told one of our host volunteers recently that she had seen a Bread & Roses show when she was in a homeless shelter. A teenager in a special needs school hugged one of our producers and thanked her for the show he had seen there and the one at a juvenile detention facility a few months before. Our performer was touched when an elderly gentleman in a convalescent home remembered a song she sang at a senior day care facility.

Thank you to all our wonderful volunteers who help remind our audience members that they are a part of, not apart from, the community.
